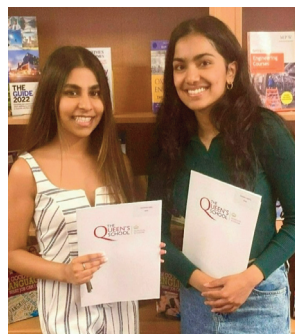
Prize Giving 2022 was delayed slightly in recognition of the passing of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth

**Cynthia Jones (Moulds) '53** passed away on 15 November 2021. After leaving school, Cynthia went to medical school at Liverpool University and obtained diplomas in Obstetrics, Gynaecology and Anaesthetics. In 1967 her and her husband Peter welcomed a baby girl, Helen. Cynthia was a lifelong painter, from the age of eight through to the 'noughties. She loved her garden and her dogs and, after retirement, was an active member of the local Methodist Church.

**Valerie Maunder (Hopper) '79** died suddenly on 16 June 2022 at home, aged 60. She is survived by her husband John and their children, Jessica, Joe and Sophie.

**Elizabeth Lunn '76** passed away on 19 July 2023. Liz was an intelligent, hardworking and deeply caring woman who played a huge role in the Queen's community, as an alumna, parent and Chairman of Governors. She is survived by her husband David and children,

Jennifer and Michael. She was instrumental in organising and getting in touch with her year group regarding reunions. In honour of her, it was agreed at her funeral (by about ten in number) that they would all make a real effort to attend the 50 year reunion in 2026. The family are also arranging a memorial service which no doubt some more of our year who live further afield will attend.

**Elisabeth Glen Ralph (Bracken) '60** passed away on 29 August 2023. Upon leaving Queen's, Elisabeth was awarded a BA (Hons) from London University and went on to teach German at secondary and sixth form level for many years. Married for 53 years, she leaves her husband John, two sons and two granddaughters.

**Pamela Stanley**, who taught Maths at Queen's for 14 years, passed away surrounded by family.

The Right Honourable **Ann Clwyd (Lewis) '56** died peacefully at her home in Cardiff on 21 July 2023, with her family and cats around her. She is remembered as a formidable journalist, MEP and, for over 34 years, Labour MP for Cynon Valley. Ann was an inspiration to many with her campaigning and support of Human Rights and International Women's Rights, including her introduction of the Female Genital Mutilation Bill. She embodied the spirit, character, fortitude and principled nature of a Queen's girl.

**Sheila Douglas (Williams) '51** passed peacefully away on 8 September 2023. Sheila was a big supporter of the 'old girls' and her daughter Lesley was a pupil at Queen's in the 1970's.
